## OUR MISSION:

The mission of Luther Memorial School is to proclaim Jesus Christ as Savior, equip ambassadors for His Service, and uphold high academic standards.

## OBJECTIVES:

Proclaiming Jesus Christ as Savior:

Luther Memorial seeks to glorify God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. We teach the Bible as the very Word of God. We teach the gospel of Jesus Christ as the power of God for salvation from sin and the only way to eternal life.

All students are taught the Bible as the history of God's work of redemption through His Son, Jesus Christ. Our curriculum includes biblical doctrine in order that students might be firmly established in the truth. We rely on the Holy Spirit to create faith in the Savior, and to enable students to put this faith into practice.

Our curriculum and daily school life are structured to provide a nurturing environment for personal Christian growth.

Luther Memorial maintains high scholastic standards in all subjects offered. Our curriculum review process ensures that we meet or exceed the academic requirements for general education set down by the State of Wisconsin. Our goal is to provide a comprehensive education, with a continuing commitment to academic excellence and careful regard for the individual's learning potential. We are pleased to offer flexibility to individual students based not only on grade level, but also on capability.

## **CURRICULUM:**

The curriculum used at Luther Memorial covers all of the subjects traditionally taught in school. The main difference is that all subjects taught are presented from a Christ-centered point of view. This curriculum prepares students very well for the continuing education at Immanuel Lutheran High School in Eau Claire, WI as well as at area schools.

Homework is assigned at the teacher's discretion. The curriculum is continuously reviewed and updated. The entire curriculum serves to glorify Jesus as Lord and Savior. The class day is warmed by the constant love of God in Christ. We seek to educate not only mind and body, but also heart and soul. Our program instills the unchanging truths of God's Word with Bible study, Catechism doctrine, prayer, hymns, and Bible verses.

## HOME AND SCHOOL:

Luther Memorial is a school that considers Christian education to be the most complete and valuable education available, since it deals with all aspects of a child's development: soul, mind, and body. The school, however, cannot take the place of the home. It can only aid parents in their God' given duty of "training" their child "in the way he should go" (Proverbs 22:6).

In our view, the school provides professional training in spiritual and secular subjects while the home upholds and reinforces the work of the school. The primary responsibility for the child's education remains with the parents. Parents will take an active part in the education of their children.

*And these words which I command you today will be in your heart; you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up.*

## ENROLLMENT:

1. Submit application  
(Available from school or website)
2. Meet with the principal and pastor
3. School Committee review and decision

#### 4. Complete registration packet and return

Our school hopes to foster a kind of faith life which goes beyond what can be accomplished in the classroom. We therefore cordially invite parents and their children to come to the worship services, Sunday school, Bible classes, and other activities of the school's sponsor, Luther Memorial Church.

We feel that it is very important that parents know and understand what is being taught to their children in our school; therefore, we also **require** that parents of new enrollees attend an introduction to conservative Lutheran teachings with the pastor. Attendance at this meeting by **both** parents is strongly encouraged. We have found that the study provides information parents both need and want.

The School Committee reserves the right to deny continued enrollment to any student if there is a conflict with the stated principles and rules of the school. It also reserves the right to deny enrollment to any student whose needs cannot be met by the available staff.

### **PARENT-TEACHER CONNECTION:**

Parent-teacher connection meetings are typically held once a quarter. These are required informational meetings for planning and volunteering for many of the school's activities throughout the course of the year. The first meeting determines when the dates will be set. Each family should be represented by at least one parent as these meetings benefit your children.

### **GRADE PLACEMENT:**

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old and first grade students must be 6 years old by September 1<sup>st</sup> before they can be admitted. Other grade placements are determined on the basis of achievement tests, past records of performance, and other indicators of ability, aptitude and maturity. The staff will determine exceptions on a case to case basis.

## **FIELD TRIPS:**

Luther Memorial will provide enhancements to the curriculum in the form of field trips to area cultural events, museums, businesses, and other learning opportunities. Parental permission is required before students can participate in field trips. Parents may also be asked to help with student transportation. Drivers transporting children to and from school activities must be insured and have a valid Wisconsin driver's license. Seat belts and car seats as required by law are required for each child transported in private vehicles.

## **IMMUNIZATIONS AND HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:**

We require that all students entering kindergarten have had a complete physical examination and must submit a report of health examination properly filled out and signed by a physician. Another physical examination is suggested prior to entrance into seventh grade. Forms for the doctor's report to the school can be obtained from your doctor's office or through the school. All health records are maintained in the school. The Immunization Checkpoint Law in Wisconsin requires minimum immunization for the first time admission in any elementary school. A child can not be admitted into our school if he/she does not meet the minimum immunization requirements. All medications must be left with the child's teacher. No medication (including pain relievers) may be dispensed without written parental permission.

Children who are ill must be kept home for the welfare both of the child and of others. Arrangements must be made for students who become ill during school hours. Parents must designate someone who is available to pick the child up within one-half hour of being notified of an illness or injury.

## **ATTENDANCE POLICY:**

Regular attendance is essential for a child's development and continued enrollment in the school. All children are expected to attend school whenever it is in session, including field trips. Our day begins with the Pledge of Allegiance, and most importantly, the morning devotion based on God's Word at 8:00am. If a student is unable to be in school on a given day or come to school late, a telephone call or note should be received by the school on the morning of the tardy or absence. Situations where the parent does not contact the school will be treated as unexcused. Absences and tardies will be excused only for the following reasons:

1. Student illness or illness of a family member
2. Funerals
3. Emergencies which prevent attendance
4. Delays caused by weather or vehicle failure

**Appointments-** Unless a medical or dental appointment is an emergency, it should be scheduled at a time when school is not in session. However, we understand that some appointment scheduling problems do happen. Parents need to inform teachers, in advance, when appointments will conflict with the school day. Children are not permitted to leave the school premises during the school hours without permission from a parent.

**Tardiness-** Punctuality is expected. Students are expected to be seated in the choir room by 8:00. Students who come into the room after the 8:00 am bell will be recorded tardy unless there was a telephone call or note given beforehand. A tardy will be excused only for the reasons stated above under Attendance. If a student is tardy 5 times in a grading period, a note will be sent home making the parent aware of the situation. If the student is tardy a 6<sup>th</sup> time during the same grading period, it will count as an unexcused absence.

**Unexcused absences-** Students who have four unexcused absences in a grading period will have a note sent home making the

parent aware of the situation and the student will serve a 30 minute detention after school. The note will also specify what day the detention will be held on. If the student has a 5<sup>th</sup> unexcused absence in the same grading period a telephone call will be made to the parent that same day to schedule a meeting. The teacher, principal, pastor, and parents will be involved at the meeting. Also the student will serve a one hour detention after school. The day of the detention will be determined by the teacher. Should the problem persist, we will follow Wisconsin state law on absenteeism and truancy.

### School Hours:

Kindergarten: 8:00am – 11:30am (Mon – Fri)  
1<sup>st</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (Full Day): 8:00am – 3:00pm (Mon – Fri)  
1<sup>st</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (Half Day): 8:00am – 11:30am (Mon – Fri)

### DISCIPLINE:

We pray that Luther Memorial is a place where Christ is honored and where our good behavior flows naturally from His love to us. We teach children to be ambassadors for Christ in all aspects of their daily life. To this end, teachers and volunteers are trained to maintain Christian discipline at all times. They strive to discipline all children fairly according to Scriptural principles and with unconditional Christian love. They are guided by our written discipline policy. Specific rules of conduct for our school, as well as discipline procedures, will be given to students and parents during the first week of classes. At LMS children are taught three basic rules. All school routines flow from these biblical commands.

### **BE KIND:**

*Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as in Christ God forgave you.* Ephesians 4:32

### **BE SAFE:**

*But everything should be done in a fitting and orderly way.* 1 Corinthians 14:40

*Therefore honor God with your body.*

1 Corinthians 6:20

## **BE RESPECTFUL:**

*Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you.* Hebrews 13:17

*Therefore encourage one another and guide each other up, just as in fact you are doing.*

1 Thessalonians 5:11

LMS expects that parents and students alike will recognize that students owe a willing obedience to their teachers, showing them respect as God's representatives.

## **DRESS CODE:**

Luther Memorial has a school dress code policy. Neatness and Christian modesty should be shown regarding the clothes children wear to school. We expect parents and students to use good taste and judgment in the matter of school attire. The faculty and School Committee reserve the right to counsel any student and his/her parents regarding inappropriate student dress.

Children who have articles of clothing that do not reflect Christian conduct will receive a note to be sent home to the parents asking that the child would refrain from coming to school with that piece of clothing. In all we say and do, we want to glorify Christ.

## **BETWEEN PARENTS & TEACHERS:**

*Report Cards*

Report cards are sent home quarterly. If a child is working below his or her abilities, a notice is sent home prior to the report card date.

### *Conferences*

Conferences are held each semester in an ongoing effort to bring school and home together in the child's education.

### *Visits*

Parents will naturally wish to inquire into their child's education. Please make arrangements to visit the classroom or meet with the staff as desired.

### *Support*

Parents are expected to support the instructors in all academic and disciplinary matters. If problems arise, parents are asked to address the teacher involved. Subsequently, if necessary, they may confer with the principal and the Board representative.

## **BOOKS AND SUPPLIES:**

Textbooks purchased by the school are used for several years. Book fees cover the cost of workbooks and approximately  $\frac{1}{4}$  the cost of the textbooks used by each student. The book fund enables the school to have textbooks that are current, and it is expected that these books be maintained in good order. Replacement fees are assessed on lost or damaged books. The book fee does not include the cost of Bibles and Catechisms. These will be purchased individually by the parents and are available through the school.

Each child is expected to bring his or her personal school supplies on the first day of school. The school furnishes a list of required supplies. Please replenish supplies as needed throughout the year.

## **TRANSPORTATION:**

Students whose parents live within the city limits of Fond du Lac must transport their own children to school. Students who live

more than two miles from Luther Memorial and outside of the Fond du Lac city limits are transported to our school at the expense of the local public school district. Other adjacent districts transport children to our school or pay parents a fixed transportation allowance if our school is within five miles of their nearest district boundary. This includes the districts of North Fond du Lac, Cambellsport, and Oakfield. Application for transportation is made by the school by May 15<sup>th</sup> for the following school year.

### **HOT LUNCH & MILK PURCHASE:**

The students are required to bring their lunch five days of the week in September and May. A hot lunch is offered (for a small fee) on Wednesdays from October through April. The supervision of this program and the kitchen work depends upon volunteer help. Others who cannot help in this way can contribute through home baking. Parents, grandparents, and others are welcome to help and participate. Your child may purchase 2% white or chocolate milk for the year at fall registration.

### **REGISTRATION & NON-MEMBER TUITION:**

Luther Memorial's tuition is divided in 9 monthly payments due on the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month starting August 15<sup>th</sup>. All accounts must be kept current in order for the student to remain enrolled in the school. If payment is not received by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month, the treasurer and/or chairman of the School Committee will contact the family to pay by the 1<sup>st</sup> of the following month. If payment is not received by the 1<sup>st</sup>, the child will not be able to attend school until their account is made current.

If a student is dismissed or withdrawn for any reason throughout the school year, the tuition is charged for the entire month, even if the student is in attendance only a portion of that month. Written notification of withdrawal must be submitted to the school office.

School report cards are not released until all accounts are made current.

## **SCHOOL PICTURES:**

Pictures of the students will be taken annually. Purchase of these pictures is not required, but your child will be included in the class composite whether you purchase your child's picture or not. In this way, we will have a composite picture of all children each school year.

## **OTHER PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Our parents bring many gifts to Luther Memorial. We appreciate their participation, which enhances our school immeasurably. Volunteer opportunities may be discussed with the volunteer coordinator. Required annual parent involvement includes the Parent-Teacher Connection meetings where further help/volunteering will be discussed.
