## As We Gather

Where is God? This is one of human beings' most frequently-asked and incorrectly-answered questions. We are tempted to believe that evidence of God's presence is found in outward circumstances. We equate good fortune with God's favor and bad fortune with His judgment. So, as long as nothing terrible is happening, God must not be too angry with us, right? We are free to go on sinning. Such foolish assumptions must be crushed. Therefore, God must constantly remind us where He intends to be found—in the gospel. He makes Himself present in Word and sacraments. Because He is always present, we realize the urgent need to turn away from the sin He despises. Because His presence is graciously hidden, we are drawn to Him for forgiveness rather than driven away from Him in fear.

Exodus 3:1-15

<sup>1</sup> Now Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law, Jethro, the priest of Midian, and he led his flock to the west side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. <sup>2</sup> And the angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush. He looked, and behold, the bush was burning, yet it was not consumed. <sup>3</sup> And Moses said, "I will turn aside to see this great sight, why the bush is not burned." <sup>4</sup> When the LORD saw that he turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." <sup>5</sup> Then he said, "Do not come near; take your sandals off your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." <sup>6</sup> And he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. <sup>7</sup> Then the LORD said, "I have surely seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters. I know their sufferings, <sup>8</sup> and I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the place of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and

the Jebusites. <sup>9</sup> And now, behold, the cry of the people of Israel has come to me, and I have also seen the oppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. <sup>10</sup> Come, I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring my people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt.” <sup>11</sup> But Moses said to God, “Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?” <sup>12</sup> He said, “But I will be with you, and this shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain.” <sup>13</sup> Then Moses said to God, “If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, ‘The God of your fathers has sent me to you,’ and they ask me, ‘What is his name?’ what shall I say to them?” <sup>14</sup> God said to Moses, “I AM WHO I AM.” And he said, “Say this to the people of Israel: ‘I AM has sent me to you.’ ” <sup>15</sup> God also said to Moses, “Say this to the people of Israel: ‘The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.’ This is my name forever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations.

# Sermon Text

1 Corinthians 10:1-13

<sup>1</sup> For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, <sup>2</sup> and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, <sup>3</sup> and all ate the same spiritual food, <sup>4</sup> and all drank the same spiritual drink. 

**LMS Mini Classes:** We will be having Mini Classes the week of Monday, April 11 - Wednesday, April 13. These will be a chance for parents, grandparents, aunts/uncles, cousins, and friends down the street to come and show/teach different hobbies or activities with our students. Time slots can be as short as 90 minutes to up to 2-3 hours. We are able to travel a small distance also. The list of possibilities is endless, but examples could include: taxidermy, candle making, soap making, flower arranging, crocheting, changing a tire, jerky making, leather work, scrap-booking, beekeeping, financial planning, sign language, changing oil, self-defense, or baking/cooking (to name a few).

**Paschal Candle:** You have probably noticed the new addition to our sanctuary. It is a large white candle next to the baptismal font. It is called a Paschal Candle or Christ Candle. This candle, along with the stand, which was made by Barry Hay, were given as a gift to the congregation in memory of Don Seibel.

To understand why the church would have a Paschal Candle, we have to understand the origins of the word paschal. Paschal is the Greek word used for the Passover. The Passover is the feast celebrated by the Jews as a reminder of God delivering the people out of slavery in Egypt. The Passover Feast reminded the people how God, on the night when He went among the Egyptians and killed all the first-born, passed over all the Israelites who had sacrificed a lamb and put the blood on the doorposts and lintels. Here, the Lord showed mercy to His chosen people.

Today as we see the Paschal Candle we are reminded how the Lord shows us mercy by the death of Christ as the sacrifice which covers us in the blood of the Lamb, saves us from death and includes us in the resurrection of Christ.

Also, we are reminded that Christ is the Light of the World. John calls Christ the light of the world and so, when we light the Paschal Candle we are reminded that light has come into the world through Christ.

The Candle is lit on three occasions. It is lit through the Easter Season as we celebrate the resurrection of Christ. It is also lit at baptisms where we are brought into Christ's death and resurrection. Finally, it is lit at funerals. There, the Paschal Candle serves as a reminder that even in the darkness of death we have the light of Christ, and death has not had the final say. For the Christian, death is only temporary because of Christ's resurrection.

The use of the Paschal Candle is meant to draw our attention back to the Light of the Word in Christ Jesus, who died for us and was raised by the glory of the Father so we too could be raised with Him.

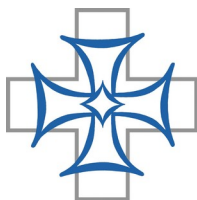
