## OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: ISAIAH 61:1-6

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; <sup>2</sup> to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; <sup>3</sup> to grant to those who mourn in Zion— to give them a beautiful headdress instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit; that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he may be glorified. <sup>4</sup> They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. <sup>5</sup> Strangers shall stand and tend your flocks; foreigners shall be your plowmen and vinedressers; <sup>6</sup> but you shall be called the priests of the Lord; they shall speak of you as the ministers of our God; you shall eat the wealth of the nations, and in their glory you shall hoast. \*

<sup>23</sup> When they were released, they went to their friends and reported what the chief priests and the elders had said to them. <sup>24</sup> And when they heard it, they lifted their voices together to God and said, "Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, <sup>25</sup> who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the Holy Spirit,

" 'Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were gathered together, against the Lord and against his Anointed'—

<sup>27</sup> for truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, <sup>28</sup> to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place. <sup>29</sup> And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness, <sup>30</sup> while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus." <sup>31</sup> And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness. \*

#### **GOSPEL LESSON:**

**LUKE 4:16-30** 

<sup>16</sup> And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read. <sup>17</sup> And the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

<sup>20</sup> And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. <sup>21</sup> And he began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." 22 And all spoke well of him and marveled at the gracious words that were coming from his mouth. And they said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" <sup>23</sup> And he said to them, "Doubtless you will guote to me this proverb, "Physician, heal yourself." What we have heard you did at Capernaum, do here in your hometown as well.' " <sup>24</sup> And he said, "Truly, I say to you, no prophet is acceptable in his hometown. <sup>25</sup> But in truth, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the heavens were shut up three years and six months, and a great famine came over all the land, <sup>26</sup> and Elijah was sent to none of them but only to Zarephath, in the land of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow. <sup>27</sup> And there were many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian." <sup>28</sup> When they heard these things, all in the synagogue were filled with wrath. <sup>29</sup> And they rose up and drove him out of the town and brought him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they could throw him down the cliff. 30 But passing through their midst, he went away. \*

# THE SERMON: MATTHEW 8:1-13

When Jesus came down from the mountain, large crowds followed him. <sup>2</sup>Just then, a leper came to him and bowed down to him, saying, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." <sup>3</sup>Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean." Immediately he was healed of his leprosy.

<sup>4</sup>Jesus said to him, "See that you tell no one. Instead, go, show yourself to the priest and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."

<sup>5</sup>When he entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him and pleaded with him, <sup>6</sup>"Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed and suffering terribly." <sup>7</sup>Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him." <sup>8</sup>The centurion answered, "Lord, I am not worthy for you to come under my roof. But only say the word, and my servant will be healed. <sup>9</sup>For I am also a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I say to this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."

<sup>10</sup>When Jesus heard this, he marveled. He said to those who were following him, "Amen I tell you: I have not found such great faith in anyone in Israel. <sup>11</sup>I tell you that many will come from the east and the west and will recline at the table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>12</sup>But the children of the kingdom will be thrown out into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

#### A BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

The LM Annual Meeting was called to order by Chairman David Bernthal and Pastor Schaller was given the floor to read his opening devotion from the Annual Report, page 3.

Recording Secretary/Treasurer Michael Sippert was given the floor to read the minutes from the previous Voters Meeting. The minutes were approved as read.

Pastor Schaller was given the floor for his report. Copies of that report are available in the standing file in the entryway.

Zach Phillips was received as a communicant member by his confession of faith. Zach's membership was ratified by motion and he was officially received as a communicant member. Pastor Schaller also reported that Madelyn (Gescheidle) Lutz has requested to be transferred from Messiah in Hales Corners.

**Pastor Schaller reported on Christian Education, Ministry and Outreach.** A Study Conference in Hales Corners is scheduled for Thursday February 6<sup>th</sup> from 11am to 4pm. The Board of Trustees CBP Presentation was made in video form and the Voters of Luther Memorial established the 2025-26 CBP Pledge at \$22,000 (matching the 2024-25 pledge). Pastor Schaller reported that he will be travelling to Uganda February 11-20 to complete a face-to-face colloquy on behalf of the Board of Doctrine. This will mean that he will be unable to attend some regular meetings, some of which will be rescheduled.

**Financial Secretary Kevin Kern** presented his report (note: the report in the Annual Report is the previous year. Copies of the updated 2024 report are inserted in mailboxes and additional copies are in the standing file. The computer was blamed for this error, though it is more likely Pastor's error).

**Treasurer/Recording Secretary Michael Sippert** presented his report printed in the Annual Report.

**Mission Committee Chairman Mike Schwersinske** presented the report of the Mission Committee.

**Elders Report** - There is no elected chairman of the elders but the elders report is in the Annual Report.

**Building and Grounds** – There is an incomplete list of completed projects in the 2024 Annual Report. Chairman Bernthal noted the projects that are upcoming in 2025.

Chairman David Bernthal noted that the School Committee report in the Annual Report is a summary of the close of the 2024 school year. He noted that the Voters of Luther Memorial have committed to continue the call process. Once the incoming Council is organized, a date will be set.

**A motion was made to accept all reports.** The motion passed.

**New Business** – Treasurer/Recording Secretary Michael Sippert presented a Council supported budget recommendation for 2025. The budget is a decrease to the 2024 Budget in large part because there is no school teacher. This would change in 2026 should a teacher accept our call. The 2025 Budget is well under the three-year average (\$142,000) and includes a new teacher from August-December should one accept our call. The budget was set at \$130,000 by motion.

Elections — Pastor Schaller expressed confusion over the LM Constitution (revised 2012) and the process of determining who is and who is not a Voter at Luther Memorial. It was noted that a number of changes were made in 2019 and 2020 which have not been made to the Constitution. A couple of men have served three consecutive terms and the constitution would have them take a year off...but there seems to be few willing voters to take a council position as we currently have open positions on the council. Once the Council is organized, a constitution committee will be appointed by the council to take a look at the LM Constitution.

**Kevin Kern and Chris Sabel** were reelected to serve a second term on the LM Council.

Gunnard Sippert and Jesse Ude were elected to the LM Council.

A motion was made to suspend the term limits required by the LM Constitution until the LM Constitution can be resolved.

**David Bernthal and Mike Schwersinske** were elected to the LM Council. Once the LM Council is organized (Meeting Set: 2/9/25), a date will be set for the Teacher Call Meeting.

The meeting was adjourned by motion.

These are not the official minutes, but the recollection of Pastor Schaller.

# **HOME DEVOTIONS FOR JANUARY 27-FEBRUARY 1, 2025**

**Monday – Matthew 4:12-17** When John is imprisoned, Jesus takes up the call to repentance and begins His ministry. He makes His headquarters in Capernaum, proclaims the kingdom of heaven, and the light shines!

Tuesday – Romans 8:1-4 Upon those in the shadow of death the light now shines in Christ Jesus, for through Him we have been set free from the law of sin and death (v2). He took on our flesh to bear our condemnation (v3).

**Wednesday – Romans 8:5-11** The fleshly mind is hostile to God, does not want to please Him, and leads to the darkness of death. But the spiritual mind knows of the resurrection in Jesus and walks to life and peace (v6).

**Thursday – Genesis 15:1-7** The LORD promises Abram countless descendants when he has yet to see the first one, but Abram believes the LORD, that He is truly his shield from all danger and his very great reward!

**Friday – Amos 3:1-8** Seven questions the LORD asks His people. They can understand a lot of things in God's creation. Should they not also understand that the LORD means it when He speaks condemnation and salvation?

**Saturday – Acts 8:26-39** The Lord reaches out to an Ethiopian through His servants Isaiah and Philip, and the Light shines for this official on the desert road to Gaza. Baptized, he continues on his way rejoicing!
