OT LESSON ECCLESIASTIES 1:1-2, 12-14; 2:18-26

The words of the Preacher, the son of David, king in Jerusalem.

²Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

¹²I the Preacher have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³And I applied my heart to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven. It is an unhappy business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. ¹⁴I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vanity and a striving after wind.

¹⁸I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me, ¹⁹and who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. ²⁰So I turned about and gave my heart up to despair over all the toil of my labors under the sun, ²¹because sometimes a person who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave everything to be enjoyed by someone who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. ²²What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun?

²³ For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

²⁴ There is nothing better for a person than that he should eat and drink and find enjoyment in his toil. This also, I saw, is from the hand of God, ²⁵ for apart from him who can eat or who can have enjoyment? ²⁶ For to the one who pleases him God has given wisdom and knowledge and joy, but to the sinner he has given the business of gathering and collecting, only to give to one who pleases God. This also is vanity and a striving after wind. *

EPISTLE LESSON:

COLOSSIANS 3:1-11

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry.

⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming. ⁷ In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸ But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator.

¹¹ Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all. *

GOSPEL LESSON:

LUKE 12:13-21

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But he said to him, "Man, who made me a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵ And he said to them, "Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." ¹⁶ And he told them a parable, saying, "The land of a rich man produced plentifully, ¹⁷ and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?'

¹⁸ And he said, 'I will do this: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." ' ²⁰ But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹ So is the one who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God.'"*

THE SERMON:

ROMANS 15:14-33

¹⁴I myself am convinced about you, my brothers, that you yourselves are also full of goodness, filled with complete knowledge, and able to instruct one another. ¹⁵But I have written a letter to you (rather boldly at times) as a reminder to you, because of the grace God has given me ¹⁶to be a public minister of Christ Jesus to the Gentiles. I am to do the priestly work of proclaiming the gospel of God so that the Gentiles would be an acceptable offering, sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

¹⁷Therefore I have a reason to boast in Christ Jesus about my service to God. ¹⁸For I will not dare to speak about anything except those things Christ accomplished through me that resulted in the Gentiles' obedience. Christ accomplished them by word and deed, ¹⁹along with the power of signs and wonders done by the power of God's Spirit. As a result, I have fully proclaimed the gospel of Christ from Jerusalem all the way around to Illyricum. ²⁰And so I consider it an honor to proclaim the gospel where Christ's name is not known, so that I may not build on another man's foundation.

²¹Instead, as it is written:

Those who were not told about him will see,
and those who have not heard will understand.

²²This is also the reason I have been prevented many times from coming to you. ²³But now I no longer have a place to work in these regions, and I have longed for many years to come to you. ²⁴So when I go to Spain, I hope to visit you on my way. After I have enjoyed being with you for a while, I hope that you will help me on my journey there.

²⁵Right now I am going to Jerusalem bringing assistance to the saints. ²⁶For Macedonia and Achaia were pleased to make a certain contribution for the poor among the saints in Jerusalem. ²⁷Indeed, they were pleased to do this and, to be sure, they are indebted to them. For if the Gentiles have come to share in their spiritual things, then the Gentiles owe it to them to serve them with material things.

²⁸So, after I complete this project by delivering this fruit safely to them, I will set out for Spain and visit you on the way. ²⁹And I know that when I come to you, I will arrive with the full blessing of Christ. ³⁰Now I urge you, brothers, through our Lord Jesus Christ and through the love of the Spirit, to struggle with me in prayers to God on my behalf. ³¹Pray that I may be rescued from those in Judea who are disobedient and that my service for Jerusalem may be acceptable to the saints, ³²so that by God's will I may come to you in joy and be refreshed in your company.

³³May the God of peace be with you all. Amen. **

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SACRAMENT:



In the early church, Communion was thought of so highly that no one except confirmed members of the church were allowed even to watch it. This practice was more strict than necessary, of course. But the early church did understand something that many today do not: that Communion was never intended for indiscriminate use by everyone, but was restricted to those who are properly prepared. If you have never communed with us before, and desire the benefits of the Lord's Supper, please set up an appointment with the pastor to discuss how you can prepare properly. **The Lord's Supper will be received standing or seated in the pews. You are asked to dispose of the empties in one of the disposals near the front of the sanctuary.**

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BIBLE READINGS FOR DEVOTIONS – AUGUST 4-9, 2025

Monday – Matthew 6:7-13 The heathen try to manipulate their gods with many words, but Jesus teaches us to pray in a few words that God’s name be honored, God’s wishes prevail, and all our true needs be truly met.

Tuesday – Acts 5:12-16 The Lord Jesus is no longer visibly present among the apostles, but He continues to work and the blessings of His ministry continue among the people. The sick, tormented — all healed! (v16)

Wednesday – Acts 5:17-24 The temple rulers imprison the apostles, but an angel frees them and sends them back to the temple to keep on telling the message of life in Christ. The captors are nonplussed!

Thursday - 1 Samuel 3:1-18 The LORD comes with a message for the priest Eli, but gives it to young Samuel to be His prophet. Samuel is afraid to tell Eli, who wants to hear and accepts the word of the LORD from Samuel.

Friday – Psalm 116:1-11 The LORD who brought His people from Egypt also saves His people from hell. He delivers from death and stumbling, even from troubles which tempt us to say in haste, “I’m all alone!”

Saturday – Psalm 116:12-19 How can we thank the LORD for everything? By looking to Him for everything, calling upon the name of the LORD (v13,17)! I will keep my vows to the LORD in the presence of all His people (v14,18).

6. Take my love, my Lord, I pour At Thy feet its treasure-store; Take myself, and I will be Ever, only, all, for Thee.
